International Haemovigilance Symposium (IHS) 2024: A Resounding Success




Date: April 11-12, 2024 Location: Royal Olympic Hotel, Athens, Greece

A big thanks to all participants, speakers, moderators, and sponsors for contributing to this remarkable event. We look forward to continuing these important discussions and collaborations in future symposia.




Updates to the IHN Board:
